- · Where do you work? I work in a hospital. Where does she work? She works at a book store.
- There is a bathroom and a bedroom upstairs. There are two windows and a door in the bedroom.
- How many bathrooms / bedrooms / doors / windows are there? There are two. How many bedrooms / bathrooms / doors do you have? We have four.
- Is there a garage in your house? Yes, there is. / are there large closets? No, there aren't.

Do you live far from here? About fifteen minutes by bus. And is the neighborhood nice? My apartment is near a park and a mall. Do you live in a house or an apartment? What's it like? ### INVITE SOMEONE TO JOIN YOU AT THE TABLE.

Simple present tense: You study English / They eat breakfast.

Present continuous: You are studying English / They are eating breakfast.

Always / Usually / Sometimes / Never

Now / This year / tomorrow morning / in the morning / on Friday

- We practice English every day / I need milk for my coffee / You watch TV every evening.
- We are cooking all our meals at home this month. / I'm eating only fruit and vegetables today.

How about some green bean salad? That sounds delicious! I love green beans. I'll check. Would you like coffee or tea? I'd like coffee, please. / No, thanks. Please pass the butter. Here you go. Do you come here often? Would you like to join me? Mmm. Sounds good.

#### DESCRIBE AND TELL SOMEONE ABOUT EVENTS AND PAST ACTIVITIES.

Yesterday / the day before yesterday / last month / two months ago / last [century].

Years, decades, and centuries

1900 = nineteen hundred

1901 = nineteen oh one

2001 = two thousand one

2010 = two thousand ten / twenty ten

1990 to 1999 = the (nineteen) nineties

1901 to 2000 = the twentieth century

2001 to 2100 = the twenty-first century

- I was at a soccer game two days ago. / He wasn't at school yesterday.
- We were at the park last Sunday. / They weren't at the party last night.

Yes / no questions: [was / were] + subject
Information questions: question word + [was / were] + subject
Questions with who as the subject: Who + [was / were]

- Were you in class yesterday? No, I wasn't. I was at work.
- Where were you last Friday night? I was at a restaurant.
- Who was not here Monday? Paul and Lisa weren't here.

### TALK ABOUT YOUR WEEKEND

Go to the beach, go running, go bike riding, go for a walk, go swimming, go for a drive

- I liked the movie / He bought some shoes / They ate pasta.
- He didn't go to school yesterday / We didn't watch the movie last night / They didn't clean the house on Saturday.

### Did + subject + base form of verb

- Did you watch TV last night? Yes, I did. / No, I didn't.
- Did she see a movie? Yes, she did. / No, she didn't.

### Wh- word + did + subject + base form of verb

· Where did you go last weekend? / What time did they go out to dinner?

Who as object: Who + did + subject + verb

· Who did they see yesterday?

Who as subject: Who + verb + object.

• Who went to the mall this morning?

What time? At about 8:00. There was? Too bad I wasn't there!

Did you do anything special? Not really. I just made dinner and watched a movie.

Did you have a good weekend? Let me think. Oh, yeah.

### Should / shouldn't + base form of the verb.

- I broke my foot. You should go to the hospital.
- I have a bad cold. You shouldn't go to school.
- Thomas has a backache. He should lie down.
- Maria has a fever. She shouldn't go to work.
- I have [ a headache]. You should take something.



What happened? I'm sorry to hear that. Does it hurt a lot?

I don't feel well. What's wrong?

You really should take something. Good idea. I hope you feel better.

### Can + subject + base form of the verb?

- Can you swim? Actually, yes, I can. No, I can't. Really? That's too bad.
